Library staff have fully catalogued the collection and are working towards improving storage. This will increase visitor access to this unique resource.




Back cover of William Baylor Hartland's nursery catalogue showing Hartland's and Cork at the 'True Home of Daffodils'.










Located in Dundrum, Co. Dublin, Ballawley Nursery specialised in alpine and herbaceous plants.










Daisy Hill Nursery was founded by Thomas Smith in Newry, Co. Down in the late 1880s.
